

# WILDLIFE VIEWING HOTSPOTS



## Wildlife Viewing Hotspots – General dates and areas that can be observed around Bonny.

<b>1</b>	White-tailed Deer Turkeys Squirrels Ring-necked Pheasant	Year round in early morning and late evening March 15 – October 15 Year round but most visible in November to February Year round
<b>2</b>	Bald Eagles	November to March
<b>3</b>	Mule Deer	Occasional resident in summertime
<b>4</b>	Waterfowl  Great Blue Heron White Pelicans Osprey	October, February 1 – mid-April. (Note: This area is closed to all public use from Nov. 1 to Jan. 31 as a waterfowl refuge.) March to October April to May April, October
<b>5</b>	Bald Eagles Canadian Geese Snow Geese	November to March. View from top of dam. November to March October 15 – November 15, March 1 – 31
<b>6</b>	Bald Eagles	November to March
<b>7</b>	Bald Eagles	November to March
<b>8</b>	Bald Eagles	November to March
<b>9</b>	Great Horned Owl	Year round. Watch for nests in tall cottonwood trees from late winter to early spring.
<b>10</b>	Smaller Birds	Excellent place to observe over 200 smaller species of birds that migrate through the area at different times.
<b>11</b>	Lesser Sandhill Cranes	Resting area October 1 – 31
<b>12</b>	Waterfowl	February to December. Good place to photograph waterfowl.
<b>13</b>	Turkey Vultures	April to October (They roost on the power lines.)
<b>14</b>	Waterfowl, especially Wood ducks and coot. Beaver and muskrats (excellent sunsets)	March to November  Year round Year round
